Dear Ms Al-Nashif,

I am writing to request that we meet, at your earliest convenience. If you have not yet been briefed on my case, you soon will be. And what you are told will be lies – the Dutch Foreign Minister was forced to correct the official parliamentary record when he repeated the misrepresentations of OHCHR managers, because national laws do protect me against defamation. For the avoidance of any doubt, I attach one of the emails in which OHCHR transmitted names to the individual email address of a Chinese diplomat. He Geng is the wife of Gao Zhisheng, who was then held in arbitrary detention in China. He describes his torture in gruesome detail in his book. Dolkun Isa is President of the World Uyghur Congress, and testified on my behalf against OHCHR. That this was necessary is clearly a disgrace.

My case has never been difficult to solve. Part of the problem has been the utter refusal of all OHCHR managers to even acknowledge my emails for the last seven years, let alone meet with me. It is ironic indeed that the *only* UN manager who consistently and personally responds to me is the Secretary-General himself, after I was given his direct email.

OHCHR can do better than this – all it actually needs to do is stop facilitating identification of victims for torture and genocide, correct the public record, apologise, and transfer me to a mutually agreeable post. These are not unreasonable requests.

I look forward to hearing from you.
